W. R. Gladwyn

Aged 85, Dies (the age should have read 83)

Brownville - July 8 -- Mr. William R. Gladwyn, 83, died this morning in this village Sunday afternoon (that's the way it was written) following an illness of two years. At that time, he suffered a stroke and during the past week his condition grew steadily weaker.

Mr. Gladwyn was born February 10, 1846, son of William and Charlotte Hamblin Gladwyn. He was a carpenter by trade and for many years was employed by Leonard & Gilmore Company and Binninger & Strange Company, both of Dexter. For the past two years he had been employed. He was a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church of Brownville and at the time of his death held the office of steward.

Mr. Gladwyn was married twice, his first wife being Miss Priscilla Wallace of Brownville whom he married on November 18, 1866. She died on July 3, 1901 and on June 29, 1904 he married Mrs. Anna Walts who survives him. Other survivors are one daughter by his first wife, Mrs. Herbert Conklin of Hounsfield, one grandson, William Conklin of Hounsfield, two grandchildren, Elaine and Leonard Conklin of Hounsfield, one sister, Mrs. Charlotte Prame, Lowville.

Funeral services will be conducted at his home on Tuesday at 2 p.m. by Rev. W. H. Bradley, pastor of the Methodist Episcopal Church of Brownville. Burial will be made in Dexter.

She was born February 11, 1877, the youngest of ten children of Stephen and Mary Wagoner Getman in the Town of Orleans. She was married to Fred D. Stopforth in Brownville, November 22, 1899, at the home of a sister, Mrs. Wm. Gladwyn*. The couple operated a farm in the Town of Brownville at LeRay.

She is survived by her husband, two daughters, Mrs. Wesley J. (Hilda) Walts, 404 South Massey St., and Mrs. Raymond (Marjorie) Cassel of Brownville; five sisters, Mrs. Fred E. Knapp, 134 Haley St., Mrs. Wm. Paul, Adams Center, Mrs. Edith Walts of Evans Mills, Mrs. Wm. Gladwyn of Brownville, and Mrs. Martha Getman of Dexter, and a brother, Monroe Getman of Watertown. Funeral services will be held Saturday afternoon at 2 in the Howland Funeral Chapel. Burial will be made in the Brownville Cemetery.

*Mrs. Gladwyn was not married to Wm. Gladwyn in 1899. She may have been married to a Walts at the time. Mr. Gladwyn's first wife was still alive at this time.

I direct all debts to be paid, and my negro man "George," and my oldest pair of oxen, and my bay mare, are to be sold for that purpose. I leave to my wife Ruth the use of 1/3 of all my lands as the law directs, and an equal division with my daughters in my personal estate. "All the children which I now have or may have in this nine months after my decease," are to be brought up until of age, and the use of all my estate is for that purpose, until my son, Richard Blydenburgh, is of age, and what is more than necessary is to be for my wife "and the child with which she is now pregnant," and for my three daughters, Elizabeth, Amy, and Mary. I leave to my wife and my unborn child, and my three daughters, all my movable estate. In today's dates, this would be Mar. 5, 1692 - notice that he died Mar. 7, 1691/2, and the will wasn't probated till 2 May 1693 - but it's not almost a two year lapse, but only 10 months.

The document says 1691, but it was actually 1692.

He was living in Southampton by Oct. 26, 1643. He had the titles of Mr. and Gentleman. On Dec. 3, 1656, he was banished from Southampton for his unreverend carriage toward the magistrates. Then he went to Setauket, where he lived when he patented and founded Smithtown, Long Island, NY.

He was traditionally known as the "Bull Rider", and his descendants were known as the "Bull Smiths". He was named "Bull" because he trained and used a bull for riding instead of a horse. He owned at least two slaves.

He was buried near his house at Missequaque.

America's First Families

Ancestor Roll Of Honor

RICHARD SMITH
SMITHTOWN, LONG ISLAND
(c.1613-1691/92)

Richard Smith was one of the early settlers of Southampton, Long Island, New York, who later became the patentee of Smithtown, and whose activities made him a prominent figure among his contemporaries and gave him a well recognized position in the history of Long Island.

Richard sailed from England on October 2, 1635, at age 22, on the ship John of London, bound for St. Christopher's. He was in Boston in 1639 and 1640. He migrated to Southampton with a group of men who lived at Lynn, in the Massachusetts Bay Colony, in June 1640. His name is found in the Southampton records between 1643 and June 6, 1656. He was made a freeman on October 7, 1648. On October 7, 1650, he was chosen constable by the General Court.

From Southampton, Richard migrated to the north side of Long Island and went to Setauket in Brookhaven. In 1663, Lion Gardiner conveyed to Richard the title to the lands covered by the deed of gift dated July 14, 1659 which described the land as between Huntington and Setauket and extending southerly half way through the island. In 1677, a patent was issued by Gov. Andros.

In 1688, Richard became a member of the Colonial Council.

Early records show that Richard was referred to as "Mr. Smith" and was considered a "gentleman", in the English social terminology. Richard designated himself as such in some of the deeds, suggesting he was from an armigerous family. This is confirmed by the fact that with his signature on legal documents, he used a seal bearing a fleur-de-lis which may have been a charge on his coat-of-arms. He had the liberal schooling of English boys of the more privileged families and based on his penmanship, may have been subjected to the influence of an atmosphere of legal or official procedures and records. Based on the many silver items handed down to various family members, Richard apparently had been brought up surrounded by a considerable degree of luxury.

Richard married Sarah probably in New England. Tradition has it that Sarah was the daughter of John Folger, who was the first of that name in New England and one of the settlers of Martha's vineyard.

The late Dr. Frederick K. Smith of Warren, Ohio, devoted 20 years to gathering and preserving all available records concerning Richard Smythe and his descendants. His work, The Family of Richard Smith of Smithtown, Long Island, was published by the Smithtown Historical Society in 1967 for the 300th anniversary of Richard Smythe receiving the patent of land.

Legacy

'Take a Right at the Bull'

There probably never was a real bull. But that didn't stop a sculptor from casting a stand-in for Richard Smith's legendary beast.

It all started in 1903 when Lawrence Smith Butler, a descendant of "The Bull Rider," regaled a classmate with the story of his ancestor's plodding ride. The classmate, sculptor Charles Rumsey, crafted a miniature statue of the bull small enough to sit on a tabletop.

But Butler wanted a bigger one. He set Rumsey to work and tried to raise the \$12,000 the artist commanded. In 1923, the five-ton bronze bull was complete.

When Butler couldn't raise enough cash, the bull was sent to the Brooklyn Museum, where it stood out front until 1932. Then it languished in storage until Butler convinced Rumsey's heirs to donate the bull to Smithtown.

The Griesbach Boyz Ancestors

The 14-foot-tall bull was unveiled atop a new concrete pedestal on May 10, 1941, at the intersection of Jericho Turnpike and Route 25A. It still stands watch today over the bustling intersection and has become a cult figure for local students who occasionally paint the bull's private parts as a rite of passage.

``The bull has become such a landmark. It's like the expression: Meet me under the Biltmore clock. You hear people give directions like, `When you see the bull, take a right,'" said Smithtown Supervisor Pat Vecchio.

The following is an excerpt from a Historical Document The Refugees of 1776 from Long Island to Connecticut

Richard Smith, the elder, was a native of Gloucester, England. He came to America prior to 1637, bringing with him a goodly number of his relatives and "a large estate". He was a cultured, gentleman, and being possessed of great strength and independance of character soon acquired marked prominence among his associates. In 1639 Richard Smith, leaving his family comfortably housed amply provided for, surrounded by relatives, friends and faithful servants who had crossed the ocean with them, took his son Richard Jr. (Major Richard the Bull) and such attendants as he deemed necessary; sailed down the Taunton river, and penetrated the virgin forests to the very heart of the Indian Country of Rhod Isaland. He purchased from the Sachems, and erected the first trading house south of Warwick. Later, he purchased from the Missequaue Indians 30,000 acres, his titles to which were subsequently confirmed by Pantents from Governors Nicolls and Andros. Meantime, In R.I. Richard Smith was sovereign of a vast estate, holding many offices of trust from the Governing Bodies of both Conn. and R.I. He was a member of the General Court of Assistants. At another time, he held a Commission as Chief Magistrate of Kings Province from Con.. In 1672, he was with Holland. The council trusted to him the putting of said Province (Which embraced half the area around R.I.) In a state of defense, Richard Smith, the father, d. in the early part of 1679. Major Richard I Smith (known as Bull Smith) seems to have been the same type of man, with his illustrious father; after the death of whom he became sole possessor of the vast estates in R.I.(They owned jointly, while on L.I.) Maj. Richard acquired even greater prominence as Patentee and Founder of Smithtown. On Sept. 5, 1680 he presented to the Authorities of Conn. a petition asking compensation for services rendered and goods furnished to the Troops. In 1686, the Royal

Government of Narragansett was established, with Maj. Richard Smith as Senior Justice and Chief Military Officer. On Mar. 26, 1687, Sir. Edmund Andros recommended him for appointment as one of his Council. In Apr. 1688, a Royal Commission was issued constitution Andros Gov. of all N. England and annexing thereto the Provinces of New York and the Jerseys under the N. England Government; with a council of 42 persons, including Maj. Richard Smith. In 1690, War with the French and Indians raged along the frontiers; and Leislars Goiverment of N.Y. demanded assistance from all the colonies. Under his call, Maj. Richard Smith, then over 75 years of age, took the field at the head of the Kings Province, R.I., Troops; and rendered effecient service. He died at his L.I. Home, in 1692; and was buried near his residence at Missequaque. His will, executed in R.I. Was dated Mar. 5, 1691. His town estate and properties in the Province of N.Y. were mainly disposed of among his children by deeds of gift.

(c1620-c1690)

The respected and renowned genealogist, Donald Lines JACOBUS, M.A. of New Haven, Connecticut, in his 1936-37 article entitled "The Family of Nathaniel BREWSTER." serialized in The American Genealogist," described Nathaniel's heritage as follows: "Perhaps no question in American genealogy has been more controversial than that of the parentage of Rev. Nathaniel BREWSTER."

The seriousness of the debate lay in the fact that the outcome would determine whether or not Nathaniel was indeed a nephew or grandson (both of which had been projected) of Elder William BREWSTER, of Mayflower fame.

The meticulous and admirable research of Mr. JACOBUS enlightened all those interested to the fact that Nathaniel was the son of Francis BREWSTER of Bristol, England, and therefore not a descendant of Elder William BREWSTER, although the possibility of some distant non-lineal connection was left open, supposing on the chance of any earlier connection between Francis' family in Bristol (prior to 1602) and Elder William's family in Yorkshire.

Nathaniel, b.c1620-24, came to New Haven, CT with his parents Francis BREWSTER (son of an earlier Francis), and Lucy b.c.1640. Nathaniel was enrolled in Harvard, graduating in what was said to have been the first graduating class of Harvard, in 1642. Later that year, he was in Dublin, Ireland, and thereafter back in England. Nathaniel's father Francis, was supposedly lost at sea in 1646 on a ship known as Lamberton's ship or the Phantom ship. Nathaniel's mother, Lucy, had remarried to Thomas PELL by Dec 7, 1647.

To paraphrase the work of Mr. JACOBUS: Nathaniel was a minister of Neatishead and Irstead, County,

Norfolk, England, as early as 1650, but about 1654 became minister at Alby. County, Norfolk. In 1655 and 1656 he made trips to Ireland with Henry CROMWELL. Also possible is that during or before 1658 he made another trip to New England, based on a reference to him in a petition there in 1658, but Nathaniel may have headed this petition without leaving England, via a written request through his stepfather Dr. PELL in Fairfield, CT.

In 1662, the will of John REYMES of Edgefield, Norfolk, England makes the reference to Nathaniel BREWSTER having married his daughter. The method of mention of her in the will, however, gives the inference that she was deceased at the time.

By 1656-60, Nathaniel had married Sarah LUDLOW, daughter of Roger LUDLOW (of established Royal descent). most likely having met and/or married her in Dublin, Ireland, as Roger LUDLOW and his family are recorded as having been in Dublin at the time of Nathaniel BREWSTER'S and Henry CROMWELL'S visits there.

It is generally accepted that Nathaniel's first wife, the daughter of John REYMES, was most likely the mother of Nathaniel's first three or four children--John, Abigail, Sarah, and possibly Timothy--and that Sarah LUDLOW BREWSTER therefore the mother of the latter children; (possibly Timothy), Daniel (baptized Oct 31, 1662 in Alby as the son of Nathaniel and Sarah), Deborah, Dinah, and Hannah.

By September 1663, Nathaniel had returned to America with his family, this time in Boston, MA. By 1665, they had relocated to Setauket, Brookhaven, Long Island, where Nathaniel and Sarah remained for the rest of their lives.

Nathaniel BREWSTER made his will March 16, 1684/5 in Suffolk County, Long Island. He is noted as having died c.Dec. 18, 1690 (his will was proved May 3, 1695). In the will he mentions his wife Sarah, his sons Timothy, Daniel, and John, and grandchildren Daniel and Abigail BURR (who were the children of his daughter Abigail who had married Daniel BURR).
